AETF congress – Tampere, Finland



On Thursday 28th April the delegation Czech National Taekwon-Do Union set out to Finland to European Championship, which was held in city Tampere. Delegation had two members – chairman of Technical committee Kamil Kolofík and secretary of TC Robert Pokorný. After arrival to Helsinki airport they had to travell by bus for 2 hours. At the evening they arrived to hotel Cumulus Koskikatu and made a little city walk.

Friday morning they spent in sporthall watching competition and meeting lot of friends from other european countries. And afternoon the AETF congress has started. This time it was voting congress – it was neccessary to vote representatives for next 4 years. Congress started at 3 p.m., according to plan. Also representatives of ITF participated as quests. Representatives from 31 countries participated the congress.

Congress ran according to agenda – presentation of report about AETF management aktivity for 4 years, financial report and presenting candidate to president AETF for next period. There was only one candidate to this post – master Loboda. He was voted to president post again. Also the candidature to post of vicepresident was not surprise. To this post was nominated master Coos v/d Hoovel, VIII. Dan. He was confirmed to his post too.

Next voting was not such easy. There was voted 6 members to AETF board, nominated was 10 candidates. After casting all votes there was and short break for counting votes, were declaration of results. To the AETF board for period 2016 – 2020 were voted:

Open Championship Taekwon-Do ITF of Czech Republic 2016



One year ago, the term of next czech championship of Taekwon-Do ITF was presented. The most important day for all competitors was approaching very quickly and the time for training got shorter.

At morning Saturday 14th May first competitors arrived to sporthall of Elementary school of Benátky nad Jizerou. This year list of participated clubs was very varied icluded some new names of clubs. 11 czech clubs arrived to the competition: Ge-Baek Mladá Boleslav, Taekwon-Do Milovice, Tong-il České Budějovice, Sonkal Praha, Taekwon-Do Silla, Sparring Mnichovice, Taekwon-do Sabom, TKD Benátky nad Jizerou, TKD Pečky, Taekwon-Do Strančice a Czech Taekwon-Do I.T.F. Asociation. This list of partipated schools from three czech national associations is proof of the fact that gen. Choi's idea about united Taekwon-Do is still alive. In total were participated 138 competitors, 26 coaches and 20 referees.

At 10 a.m., after finishing registration, corrections in cathegories and meeting of coaches and referees, all competitors lined up for opening ceremony leaded by president of Czech National Taekwon-Do Union, Mr. Viktor Stein, IV. Dan.

There were preparated four rings for competition, one of this was for cathegories Special techniques and Power test. As ussually, competition started with tull cathegories of the smallest competitors. These cathegories was the most occupied. It was not exceptional that in one cathegories started more than 20 competitors. In these cathegories competitors had to go through 4 elimination rounds to compete in final round. As we went along the competition, diplomas and medalls were awarded. Alongside tull cathegories there were cathegories Special techniques and Power test on ring nr. 4.

At 13.30 cathegories of tulls were done. So we started with matsogi and team tulls. In total 13 teams were registrated. They were divided to childs and adults teams. Cathegories of matsogi started again with the smallest competitors. Winners of cathegories was awarded with diploma, medall and gift-bag from our honoured sponzor – shop with martial arts equipment named Hayashi. As the last cathegory there were our biggest competitors – seniors +85 kg. This is the most watched and most attractive for spectators. The last one match ended on 5.15 p.m.

110th IIC Warsaw, Poland



At weekend 27th – 29th May there was held 110th international instructor course (IIC) in Poland capital Warsaw. Trainings were under leading of Grandmaster Hector Marano (IX. Dan, Argentina), Grandmaster Kim Ung Lan (IX. Dan, Germany) and Master Paul Weiler (VII. Dan, Germany). Also the Czech National Taekwon-Do Union had its representatives on this important event – Chairman of Technical committee Kamil Kolofík and Lenka Kolofíková (both IV. Dan).

Participation on this seminar was sizeable – there were 263 participants. We could see participants from more than two tens countries (Poland, Bulgaria, Denmark, Netherlands, Georgia, Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, Uzbekistan, Romania, Ireland, England, Norway, Sweden, Germany, Belarus, Latvia, Israel, Italy, Lebanon, Hungary, Scotland, Argentina and Czech Republic).

Extraordinary was also the number of masters and grandmasters participated. Except three high mentioned lectors there were 23 masters and 1 grandmaster as participants.

Grandmaster Hector Marano leaded as usually technical part of IIC – all tulls and many basic techniques were practiced and corrected Grandmaster Kim Ung Lan focused to selfdefence and training of sparrings. Innovation in IIC program was very interesting presentation by Master Paul Weiler about unhealthy drills, which are unfortunately part of many training sessions done. Heart of his presentation was that trainers should start to think about drills used in their trainings instead of to blindly perform drills which they have seen somewhere. Part of presentation was also performing of bad drills using model of vertebral column and joints – there we can see very well how bad drills as sit-ups are harming the spine. There were many questions for master Weiler about concrete drills so his presentation was prolonged a little bit.
