



## Q2 How did the hotel fulfill your expectations? (cost vs. quality, services, restaurant and location)



### Q3 How did the transportation fulfill your expectations? (cost vs. timeliness and fidelity)



Q4 How did the competition arena fulfill your expectations? (location, size, air conditioning, locker rooms, toilets and services)



## Q5 How did you like the opening ceremony?



### Q6 How well was the competition organized? (timely information, exact schedules and clear communication)



### Q7 Whether being a competitor, spectator or umpire yourself, what kind of after taste did the umpiring in the competitions leave?



Q8 How was the lunch that was provided by the organizer? How did you liked the cafeteria at the arena?



Q9 How well did you got information regarding the competition before, during or after the competition?How well did the communication work?



The event was perhaps larger than expected by the organiser based on previous Euro Cups so in some ways I can understand why certain things did not go so well. For example the arena was too small for the size of the event but this can be explained by the previous comment. The level of communication was not so good during the event. The communication in advance through the facebook page was good though. The security staff made the job of the coach difficult at times. As we were not getting up to date info we had to constantly check what was happening but the staff did not make this easy. On the up side the organisers were very pleasant and helpful when approached. It would be better to have a large screen with updates and the order of the event kept live and any changes announced on the screens. The level of umpiring was poor. However the organiser cannot take sole blame here, the NAs need to make sure they send experienced and well trained umpires and the ITF/AETF needs to look at more regular training/perhaps use technology and have educational videos online about refereeing, the rules etc so we can improve the level. The level of umpiring needs to catch up with and surpass the level of competitors. The level of competitors at the event was very good. It was great to have the event for the younger kids so that they can gain international experience. However splitting sparring only by weight and having no grade split at all is not safe for yellow/green belts. With regard to accommodation and transport, many teams organised their accommodation independently as it was cheaper to pay the fine and book outside the package. The same is true with transport, it was cheaper to organise a bus independently. There is an inconsistency with the competition rules which causes confusion. IF we expect the standard of our art to be respected and we expect a professional approach from competitors and coaches (whom the competition is primarily for), then umpires are requested to act in a professional way. The air conditioning therefore was also not ideal, putting competitors in an environment that probably limited their full abilities and especially their stamina. The communication at the rings and announcement of competitors wasn't always clear and/or satisfactory. A better system needs to be in place to avoid coaches having to inquire frequently when their competitors are needed in the ring, therefore crowding the areas around the rings, which in turn makes the job harder for the ring announcers, who have to shout over a large crowd.
