


Mr. Stephen Ryan, V Dan, ITA Umpire Chairperson and Mr. Ken Leahy V Dan, ITA Umpire Vice Chairperson, assisted by Miss Laura Cullen 3rd Dan, Tournament IT Co-ordinator conducted an ITA national umpire workshop on Sunday January 29th at the Cork International Airport Hotel. This workshop was offered on a free of charge basis, with the costs being covered by the ITA. The course was attended by 49 participants from Cork, Clare, Limerick, Wexford, Wicklow and further afield including Master Kenneth Wheatley (I.T.A. President) and Master Patrick O'Rourke.



On Saturday and Sunday the 21st and 22nd January the Taekwon-Do Advisory Board of the Irish Martial Arts Commission held an Introduction to Coaching ITF Taekwon-Do Course in Shannon Taekwon-Do Centre. 20 coaches, 15 of whom were from the ITA, completed two days of training under the supervision of Adrian Byrne and Stephen Ryan, both CDPI (Coaching Development Programme for Ireland) accredited tutors

Foreword by Master Wheatley:



The 2012 edition of the ITA Cork Open Championships took place on the 18th and 19th of February. The long running annual competition was held for the second time in Neptune Stadium, which is situated in the heart of Cork City. The modern stadium was selected as a venue to enhance the atmosphere of the event and to cater for the growing number of competitors attending the tournament per annum. This year 578 participants representing 31 clubs from throughout Ireland took part. Out of that 560 came from within ITA, 14 from RITA, 2 from INTA and 2 from TKDI.

March 2012





There were 120 participants with 11 Masters from 13 countries, Scotland, Czech Republic, England, Finland.

May 2012

On the weekend of the 12th and 13th of May an Introduction to Coaching Taekwon-Do course was held in Donabate Taekwon-Do Club under the auspices of the Taekwon-Do Advisory Board and IMAC. 17 Participants undertook 2 days of training covering topics such as; the child athlete, the role of the coach, motivation and discipline, observation skills, warm up, physical development, technical skills and instruction methodology, games for understanding and sparring tactics.



The Dublin Open took place on the weekend of the 19 & 20th of May in the Baldoyle Arena, Dublin, with exactly 500 competitors coming from 29 clubs all over Ireland for the two day event. The tournament began at 10am sharp on both days and finished approximately within its designated time frame. This was due to the efficient, committed and professional work of the tournament and umpire committee in preparation leading up to and during the event, which includes Mr. Stephen Cooley (Tournament organiser), Mr. Adrian Byrne (Tournament Administrator), Mr. Mark Buckley (Tournament Director), Mr. Stephen Ryan (Umpire Chairperson) and Ms. Laura Cullen (Tournament IT Coordinator).

On Sunday 27th of May, 82 members of ITA clubs from around the country ranging from 3rd Kup to 7th Dan travelled to Ennis for the second ITA technical seminar of 2012. The seminar was led by the ITA technical committee of Master Kenneth Wheatley 7th Dan, Mr Niall Jones 5th Dan & Mr Stephen Ryan 5th Dan and the three instructors did an excellent job in providing instruction and feedback to all

participants. Of the 82-strong group, 48 black belts were in attendance, this included several instructors and high-degree black belts.





Summer 2102 saw the ITA host the ITF International Umpire Course in Limerick on the weekend of the 30th of June & 1st of July. The event was the largest Umpires course ever run by the ITF with over 180 participants from 18 countries in attendance. With participants traveling from Argentina, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, England, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Russia, Scotland, Sweden, USA and Vietnam, this was an historic IUC as it was the first time that the updated ITF rules, which will be introduced from January 2013, were presented.

The ITA Summer Blackbelt grading took place on the weekend of 16 & 17th of June in Rathcoole, Co. Dublin. 38 candidates presented for testing for grades ranging from 1st to 5th Degree Blackbelt. The event was hosted in the Rathcoole Community Centre by Carl & Stephen Smullen of Newlands Taekwon-Do Club. The grading was run in two adjoining training halls with two examiner panels on both days to ensure maximum efficiency. The grading was conducted using the ITA grading software meaning examiners could enter scores & feedback extremely quickly and results could be calculated instantly at the end of the grading and feedback could be given to instructors and students.

The Irish Taekwon-Do Association held its annual summer camp in Mount Melleray, Co. Waterford from the 13th to the 16th of July. This was the 5th year for the camp to be held at the Mount Melleray scout centre and it was attended by students of all ages and grades from clubs around the country. The participants arrived for lunch on Friday after which the group was split in to a junior class as well as a cadet and senior class; each group did 10 -two hour sessions over the weekend working on sparring, patterns, self-defence, kicking and fundamental movements. Sept. 2012

The ITA annual Examiners Conference took place in North Mon Taekwon-Do, Cork City on Saturday September 15th 2012. The conference is a key event on the ITA calendar as it is a forum for the senior grades of the association to meet, discuss and improve the structure of the ITA black belt exam, black belt syllabus and other technical matters in the ITA. The conference was attended by 18 examiners from 4th - 7th Dan black belt, with ITA's three masters; Master Kenneth Wheatley (ITA President and Technical Director), Master Patrick O'Rourke, and Master Neil Franks all in attendance as well six 6th Dans, seven 5th dans and two 4th Dans.

The ITA Instructor workshop was held in North Mon TKD, Cork City on Sunday September 16th 2012. The workshop was attended by ITA instructors from all across Ireland, and included the attendance of ITA masters; Master Wheatley, Master O'Rourke and Master Franks. The workshop was lead by the ITA Technical Committee; Master Kenneth Wheatley VII Dan, Mr. Niall Jones V Dan and Mr. Stephen Ryan V Dan. The idea of the workshop was to help standardise the teaching of the ITA syllabus among ITA instructors but also for instructors to share ideas, especially with the new Taekwon-Do season commencing.





Oct. 2012

The ITA came out on top at the IV ITF World Cup in Brighton, England from October 4th to 8th 2012, finishing number 1 out of 163 schools/associations. The ITA was recognised as the best association at the event after our squad won an amazing 21 gold, 17 silver and 20 bronze medals. ITA competitors Louise McCagh and Chloe Aboud also took home the awards for best overall senior and junior female respectively. (full report)

On Wednesday November 20th 2012 the Federation of Irish Sport hosted their National Awards to Irish Sport Volunteers and Celebratory Lunch at the prestigious Aviva Stadium Lansdowne Road in our capitol city Dublin. Master Wheatley attended the awards in his capacity as Chair of the Irish Martial Arts Commission by invitation of the Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Tourism & Sport, Minister Michael Ring T.D.

The Irish Taekwon-Do Association hosted the 2012 Irish Cup in the University of Limerick Arena on the 17th & 18th of November. Saturday 17th was for cadets (14 – 17) and seniors, while those under-14 years of age competed on the Sunday. The full arena was used with four rings in operation on the Saturday & seven rings working on Sunday. This was one of the largest tournaments to be run by the ITA with 500 competitors from Ireland, Scotland, Sweden, Northern Ireland, Italy, Finland and France. The tournament was also attended by Grandmaster Paul Cutler from Northern Ireland, Master George Vitale from New York as well as the ITA's own Master Kenneth Wheatley, Master Pat O'Rourke and Master Neil Franks.
